

Monday Jude

It is always timely to be reminded about the reality and danger of false teachers. Though Jude's letter is very short, it is full of good warnings, teaching, and motivation concerning false teachers. Find out how history helps us prepare for the future.

1. Read Jude – Jude identified himself in the first verse as the author of this little letter. How did he describe himself?
2. Is he writing to saved or unsaved people?
3. What three words did he use to describe his recipients?
4. Who sanctifies them?
5. In Whom are they preserved?
6. According to verse 2, what three things did Jude wish to be multiplied to the people?
7. Jude called the people “beloved” in verse 3. What does that reveal about his attitude toward them?
8. This letter was not an afterthought for Jude; it was very important to him. According to verse 3, how much energy did he expend in writing this little letter?
9. After Jude reminded them of the common salvation that is in Jesus Christ, what did he say that it was needful for him to do and instruct them?

False teachers are always a real danger. They are subtle, but dangerous, and really deadly. It is on of the Christians' jobs to be ware of them and to fight against their teaching.

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1. Read Jude – Jude told the people in verse 3 to contend for the faith earnestly. This is not a half-hearted effort. What does it mean to contend earnestly?
2. According to verse 4, what is the reason for having to contend for the faith?
3. These men that crept into the church were false teachers. According to verse 4, what were they teaching?
4. Jude was quick to mention that men had in the past taught false things, and their condemnation was certain. Why do you think he mentioned that to the people?
5. Jude wanted to remind the people of something in verse 5 even though they already knew it. What was it?
6. According to verse 6, what rebellious beings are awaiting their judgment?
7. What other example of judgment against false teachers did Jude give in verse 7?
8. The people of Sodom and Gomorrah weren't teaching false doctrine, but false practice. What else can teach false practice?

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1. Read Jude – God judged false teachers from the past. He has the rebellious angels reserved for judgment in the last day. He destroyed the people of Sodom and Gomorrah who taught wicked living. The past teaches us that God does not tolerate false teaching. What kind of warning does that give you for today?
2. What did Jude call the false teachers in verse 8?
3. What does that reveal about his attitude toward false teachers?
4. In verse 8 Jude described three things that these false do. What are they?
5. One of the things they do is to speak evil of dignities. Many people teach that government has no authority over us. How would you respond to someone who made that claim?
6. In verse 9 Michael the archangel disputed with Satan over the body of Moses. What did Michael not do in that dispute?
7. If Michael the archangel didn't bring accusation against Satan, should we ever speak evil of those in authority?

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1. Read Jude – According to verse 10, of what do false teachers speak negatively?
2. They only speak the things they know by themselves. They speak nothing of faith. Who is hurt by doing this?
3. Verse 11 says that false teachers followed in the way of Cain. Cain did his own thing to try to please God. He was a false teacher. How do false teachers today do the same thing?
4. Balaam, a prophet of God, took money to prophesy against Israel. He was motivated by money. How do false teachers today show that they are also motivated by money?
5. Jude didn't have many kind words for them in verses 12-13. When they come to eat with you, they look out only for their own good. What does his comparison to clouds teach you about them?
6. What does his comparison to fruit trees teach?
7. What does his comparison to waves teach?
8. What is reserved for them?

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1. Read Jude – Whom did Jude mention in verse 14 that prophesied about false teachers?
2. What is the significance that he started his prophecy with saying that Christ is coming with ten thousands of His saints?
3. Jude used the word “ungodly” four times in verse 15. What do you think he wants us to know about false teachers and their actions?
4. According to verse 15, what two things is He coming to do?
5. Of what two things will He convict them?
6. How did Jude further describe false teachers in verse 16?
7. What kind of words did Jude say that false teachers speak?
8. Why do they use these great swelling words?
9. It is easy to that the motivation for their actions is self. What does God think about self-centered people?

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Saturday Jude

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1. Read Jude – Jude didn't want to write such a pointed letter and have the people just sit and do nothing about the information they had received. According to verse 17, what did he want them to remember?
2. According to verse 18, what did the Apostles tell them?
3. What other descriptions did Jude give for false teachers in verse 19?
4. What two things did Jude tell them to do in verse 20?
5. What two things did Jude tell them to do in verse 21?
6. What did Jude tell us to have each other in verse 22?
7. How would having compassion for each other make a difference in fight off false teaching?
8. Some people may have already gone a little farther than they should have. According to verse 23, what should we do for them?
9. According to verse 23, what are we to hate?

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1. Read Jude – Jude's little letter contains some big, powerful words of warning and condemnation. He concluded his little letter with big, powerful words of praise. He dedicated the last two verses to Jesus Christ. What is He able to prevent us from doing?
2. Why is that statement so important in this little letter?
3. How is Jesus able to present us to His Father?
4. According to Ephesians 5:25-26, what did Christ do in order to be able to present us to His Father?
5. Back in Jude how did he describe Jesus Christ in verse 25?
6. What four things did Jude want Jesus to receive?
7. When did Jude want Jesus to receive the benefit of those things?
8. Jude wrote about the danger of false teachers. He concluded with taking our attention back to Jesus. Why is refocusing on Jesus so important in defeating false teaching?

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
